

Road Safety Awareness Programme

On 13 January 2026, the students of St. Thomas' College actively participated in a Road Safety Awareness Programme conducted outside the college premises. The programme was organised with the objective of creating awareness among the general public about the importance of following road safety rules and regulations.
